FY2016 Project Summary

The General Services Administration (GSA) proposes a repair and alteration project to upgrade the façade of the U.S. Court of International Trade at the James L. Watson Court of International Trade (CIT) building located in the 26 Federal Plaza Complex in New York, NY. The proposed façade upgrades will bring the building into compliance with the Interagency Security Council's (ISC's) Security Criteria.

This project was among those previously included in GSA's FY 2014 Capital Investment Program. The prospectus was not approved by the Senate Committee on Environment and Public Works and the House Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure, and no funds were appropriated. GSA is resubmitting the project in FY 2016 with a revised scope and budget.

The Watson CIT is an approximately 175,000 gross-square-foot modern-styled glass-curtain-wall clad building constructed in 1968 as a federal courthouse and office building to house the U.S. Court of International Trade (USCIT). The courthouse has eight above-grade floors and a basement floor, and a basement parking garage with 40 parking spaces. It is connected to the Jacob K. Javits Federal Building and annex with a four-story pedestrian bridge. The two buildings together comprise the 26 Federal Plaza Federal Complex.

Proposed Project

The proposed project consists of the application of a wet glazed blast film to the vision glass panels of the Watson CIT façade and the installation of metal screen protection at a limited number of glass panels, and the abatement and containment of hazardous materials encountered during the project. The proposed work will comply with a "medium level of protection" as defined by the 2010 U.S. Government Interagency Security Committee's (ISC) Criteria. The upgrade will be designed so that the USCIT can remain in the building during project construction.

Justification

The proximity of the Watson CIT to other high profile federal buildings and courthouses elevate the building's security risk. The proposed work will provide the "medium level of protection" as defined by the U.S. Government Interagency Security Committee's (ISC) criteria, providing a safer work environment for USCIT.

Summary of Energy Compliance

This project will be designed to conform to requirements of the Facilities Standards for the Public Buildings Service and will implement strategies to meet the Guiding Principles for High Performance and Sustainable Buildings. GSA encourages design opportunities to increase energy and water efficiency above the minimum performance criteria.
