INVEST IN AMERICA ACT

Funding Highlights

The INVEST in America Act is a \$715 billion surface transportation reauthorization and water infrastructure bill that will create good-paying jobs to rebuild and reimagine America's surface transportation infrastructure, with investments in roads, bridges, transit, rail, and drinking water and wastewater infrastructure. This package helps meet the president's vision—as laid out in the American Jobs Plan—by investing in American workers and communities of all sizes, while tackling the climate crisis head-on.

Wastewater Infrastructure:

- \$40 billion: Clean Water State Revolving Fund
- \$2 billion: Grants to municipalities to capture, treat, or reuse sewer overflows or stormwater
- \$2.5 billion: Grants for state water pollution control programs
- \$1 billion: Clean water pilot programs and projects for climate resiliency
- **\$1 billion:** Alternative water source projects, such as wastewater or stormwater reuse, to augment the existing water supplies
- **\$1 billion:** Clean Water Act grants to municipalities to implement treatment standards for PFAS and other emerging contaminants
- \$2.5 billion: Wastewater infrastructure assistance to address backlog of needs for Indian Tribes
