At the end of the amendment, add the following: Page 35, after line 10, insert the following:

(j) PROHIBITION ON FUNDING FOR MATERIALS PRO DUCED BY FORCED LABOR.—

3 (1) IN GENERAL.—None of the funds made
4 available by this section shall be used to purchase,
5 import, or subsidize goods materials, technology, or
6 minerals produced, manufactured, sourced, or mined
7 through child labor or forced labor, either as direct
8 costs or any proration as an indirect cost.

9 (2) CERTIFICATION.—The Secretary of Com-10 merce shall certify whether any electric vehicles, 11 electric vehicle charging stations, solar panels, or 12 other components of infrastructure contain copper, 13 nickel, cobalt, platinum group elements, rare earth 14 elements, or other minerals or components pur-15 chased, imported, or subsidized in contravention of 16 paragraph (1).

(3) DEFINITIONS.—In this subsection:

(A) CHILD LABOR.—The term "child labor" has the meaning given the term in Article 3 of the International Labor Organization Convention concerning the prohibition and immediate action for the elimination of the worst forms of child labor (December 2, 2000).

(B) FORCED LABOR.—The term "forced labor" means all labor practices that violate human rights, including industries and host countries identified by the Department of Labor, and the practices in Xianjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region of the People's Republic of China and the Democratic Republic of the Congo.
