3	(a) In General.—For incidents DR-4336-PR,
4	DR-4339-PR, DR-4340-USVI, and DR-4335-USVI/
5	For any major disaster or emergency declared under the
6	Robert T. Stafford disaster Relief and Emergency Assist-
7	ance Act (42 U.S.C 5121 et seq.) in Puerto Rico or the
8	United States Virgin Islands, a subrecipient in meeting
9	any Federal cost-sharing requirement may use available
10	funds from any disaster recovery program/source, includ-
11	ing Community Development Block Grants – Disaster Re-
12	covery, Community Development Block Grants, commu-
13	nity disaster loans, and any in-kind contributions (unless
14	prohibited by law) to meet any Federal cost-sharing re-
15	quirement. Such funds or loans shall cover the cumulative
16	costs of any approved obligation under the specific public
17	assistance category determined by the Federal Emergency
18	Management Administration under such Act rather than
19	having to apply individually to each specific cost estimate
20	or project worksheet issued under such obligation.
21	(b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this section, the
22	term "subrecipient" means a local government or a non-
23	governmental organization (NGO).
