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## A BILL

To amend the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, review a final rule of the Federal Emergency Management Agency, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*

2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Small State and Rural

5       Rescue Act”.

1   **SEC. 2. DESIGNATION OF SMALL STATE AND RURAL ADVO-**

2                   **CATE.**

3       Section 326(c) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Re-  
4 lief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5165d) is  
5 amended—

6                   (1) by striking “and” at the end of paragraph  
7                   (2);

8                   (2) by redesignating paragraph (3) as para-  
9                   graph (4); and

10                  (3) by inserting after paragraph (2) the fol-  
11                  lowing:

12                  “(3) assist States in the collection and presen-  
13                  tation of material in the disaster or emergency dec-  
14                  laration request relevant to demonstrate severe local-  
15                  ized impacts within the State for a specific incident,  
16                  including—

17                  “(A) the per capita personal income by  
18                  local area, as calculated by the Bureau of Eco-  
19                  nomic Analysis;

20                  “(B) the disaster impacted population pro-  
21                  file, as reported by the Bureau of the Census,  
22                  including—

23                  “(i) the percentage of the population  
24                  for whom poverty status is determined;

25                  “(ii) the percentage of the population  
26                  already receiving Government assistance

1                   such as Supplemental Security Income and  
2                   Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Pro-  
3                   gram benefits;

4                   “(iii) the pre-disaster unemployment  
5                   rate;

6                   “(iv) the percentage of the population  
7                   that is 65 years old and older;

8                   “(v) the percentage of the population  
9                   18 years old and younger;

10                  “(vi) the percentage of the population  
11                  with a disability;

12                  “(vii) the percentage of the population  
13                  who speak a language other than English  
14                  and speak English less than ‘very well’;  
15                  and

16                  “(viii) any unique considerations re-  
17                  garding American Indian and Alaskan Na-  
18                  tive Tribal populations raised in the  
19                  State’s request for a major disaster dec-  
20                  laration that may not be reflected in the  
21                  data points referenced in this subpara-  
22                  graph;

23                  “(C) the impact to community infrastruc-  
24                  ture, including—

1                         “(i) disruptions to community life-sav-  
2                         ing and life-sustaining services;  
3                         “(ii) disruptions or increased demand  
4                         for essential community services; and  
5                         “(iii) disruptions to transportation, in-  
6                         frastructure, and utilities; and  
7                         “(D) any other information relevant to  
8                         demonstrate severe local impacts.”.

9 **SEC. 3. GAO REVIEW OF A FINAL RULE.**

10                 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General shall  
11                 conduct a review of the Federal Emergency Management  
12                 Agency’s implementation of its final rule, published on  
13                 March 21, 2019, amending section 206.48(b) of title 44,  
14                 Code of Federal Regulations (regarding factors considered  
15                 when evaluating a Governor’s request for a major disaster  
16                 declaration), which revised the factors that the Agency  
17                 considers when evaluating a Governor’s request for a  
18                 major disaster declaration authorizing individual assist-  
19                 ance under the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and  
20                 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5121 et seq.).

21                 (b) SCOPE.—The review required under subsection  
22                 shall include the following:

23                         (1) An assessment of the criteria used by the  
24                 Agency to assess individual assistance requests fol-

1 lowing a major disaster declaration authorizing individual assistance.

3 (2) An assessment of the consistency with  
4 which the Agency uses the updated Individual As-  
5 sistance Declaration Factors when assessing the im-  
6 pact of individual communities after a major dis-  
7 aster declaration.

8 (3) An assessment of the impact, if any, of  
9 using the updated Individual Assistance Declaration  
10 Factors has had on equity in disaster recovery out-  
11 comes.

12 (4) Recommendations to improve the use of the  
13 Individual Assistance Declaration Factors to in-  
14 crease equity in disaster recovery outcomes.

15 (c) REPORT.—Not later than 1 year after the date  
16 of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller General shall  
17 submit to the Committee on Transportation and Infra-  
18 structure of the House of Representatives and the Com-  
19 mittee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs  
20 of the Senate a report on the review required under this  
21 section.
