Dear Chairman DeFazio and Ranking Member Graves:

The National Water Resources Association (NWRA) thanks you for your efforts to reauthorize the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF). The Water Quality Protection and Job Creation Act of 2021 (H.R. 1915) would reauthorize critical funding for water infrastructure. NWRA supports the reauthorization and expansion of this vital infrastructure funding. We are also supportive of grant funding authorized by H.R. 1915 aimed the treatment of emerging contaminants and issues presented by per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). Utilities are not the *producers* of PFAS, but the *receivers* of PFAS. Federal dollars to assist local water providers in dealing with these chemicals is both necessary and appreciated.

As you know an investment in water infrastructure is an investment in our nation's economy, its health, and its future. Sanitary wastewater services and clean drinking water dramatically improve public health and safety and are vital to every community. Access to a reliable supply of water is a fundamental necessity for any and all economic development. Investing in water infrastructure is one of the most prudent investments the federal government can make. Reauthorizing funding for the CWSRF program will go a long way toward meeting our nation's water infrastructure needs while stimulating economic growth and protecting countless communities.
