3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Transportation
4 shall establish the Rural Opportunities to Use Transpor5 tation for Economic Success Office (hereinafter referred
6 to as the ROUTES Office), to—

7 (1) improve analysis of rural projects applying
8 for Department of Transportation discretionary
9 grants, including ensuring that project costs, local
10 resources, and the larger benefits to the American
11 people and the economy are appropriately consid12 ered; and

(2) provide rural communities with technical assistance for meeting the Nation's transportation infrastructure investment need in a financially sustainable manner.

17 (b) OBJECTIVES.—The ROUTES Office shall—

18 (1) collect input from knowledgeable entities19 and the public on the benefits of rural transpor-

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tation projects, the technical and financial assistance
required for constructing and operating rural transportation infrastructure and services, and barriers
and opportunities to funding such rural transportation projects;

6 (2) evaluate data on rural transportation chal-7 lenges and determining methods to align the Depart-8 ment of Transportation's discretionary funding and 9 financing opportunities with the needs of rural com-10 munities for meeting National transportation goals; 11 and

(3) educate rural communities about applicable
Department of Transportation discretionary grants,
developing effective methods to evaluate rural
projects in discretionary grant programs, and communicating those methods through program guidance.

18 (c) ROUTES COUNCIL.—

19 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall establish
20 the ROUTES Council (hereinafter referred to as the
21 "Council") to—

22 (A) organize, guide, and lead the
23 ROUTES Office; and

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1	(B) coordinate rural-related funding pro-
2	grams and assistance among the modal admin-
3	istrations.
4	(2) Membership.—
5	(A) IN GENERAL.—The Council shall be
6	composed of the following officers of the De-
7	partment of Transportation, or their designees:
8	(i) The Under Secretary of Transpor-
9	tation for Policy.
10	(ii) The General Counsel.
11	(iii) The Chief Financial Officer and
12	Assistant Secretary for Budget and Pro-
13	grams.
14	(iv) The Assistant Secretary for Re-
15	search and Technology.
16	(v) The Administrators of the—
17	(I) Federal Aviation Administra-
18	tion;
19	(II) Federal Highway Adminis-
20	tration;
21	(III) Federal Railroad Adminis-
22	tration; and
23	(IV) Federal Transit Administra-
24	tion.

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1	(vi) The Chief Infrastructure Funding
2	Officer.
3	(vii) The Assistant Secretary for Gov-
4	ernment Affairs.
5	(viii) The Director of the Office of
6	Public Affairs.
7	(B) CHAIR.—The Under Secretary of
8	Transportation for Policy shall be the Chair of
9	the Council.
10	(C) Additional members.—The Sec-
11	retary of Transportation or the Chair of the
12	Council may designate additional members to
13	serve on the Council.
14	(3) Additional modal input.—To address
15	issues related to safety and transport of rural com-
16	modities, the Council shall consult with the Adminis-
17	trators (or their designees) of the—
18	(A) Maritime Administration;
19	(B) Saint Lawrence Seaway Development
20	Corporation; and
21	(C) National Highway Traffic Safety Ad-
22	ministration.
23	(4) DUTIES.—Members of the Council shall—
24	(A) participate in all meetings and relevant
25	Council activities and be prepared to share in-

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1	formation relevant to rural transportation infra-
2	structure projects and issues;
3	(B) provide guidance and leadership on
4	rural transportation infrastructure issues and
5	represent the work of the Council and Depart-
6	ment of Transportation on these issues to exter-
7	nal stakeholders; and
8	(C) recommend initiatives to the Chair of
9	the Council to consider, establish, and staff any
10	resulting activities or working groups.
11	(5) MEETINGS.—The Council shall meet bi-
12	monthly.
13	(6) Work products and deliverables.—
14	The Council may develop work products or
15	deliverables to meet its goals, including—
16	(A) an annual report to the Congress de-
17	scribing Council activities for the past year and
18	expected activities for the coming year;
19	(B) any recommendations to enhance the
20	effectiveness of Department of Transportation
21	discretionary grant programs regarding rural
22	infrastructure issues; and
23	(C) other guides and reports for relevant
24	groups and the public.

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
